June 8, 2026 Council Meeting Report

CAO Report

- Chinooks Edge will be moving in portables at Jessie Duncan for this fall.
- Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework: (ICF) meeting is scheduled for August 12 – Penhold is hosting
- The Smile Cookie Campaign was a huge success, raising \$7,334.67 for the Penhold Youth Club (PYC). Thank you to everyone who supported the campaign this season.

Multiplex Report

- The Bull Jam was a huge success. A debrief was held for possible considerations next year.
- Cornhole tournament June 12-13 is open to public on Friday.
- In May 18,594 people came into the complex.
- The floor in the Gymnasium will be polished the end of June.

Operations Report

- Dock is being installed at the Multiplex pond
- Splash Park up and running
- Access to Dog Park being constructed
- Sidewalks and road repairs are underway

New Business

2025-2028 Strat Plan was presented and reviewed. This is an ever-changing document.

Council requested Admin put forward Councillor Muller's name for the ABMunis Award of Excellence.

June 22, 2026 Council Meeting Report

CAO Report

A Development Agreement is now in place with Melcor for the next phase of Oxford Landing. Work on the new subdivision to happen soon – weather dependent.

The sale of the Fire Hall will be finalized by the end of June.

The June 9 Grain Elevator Tour was well received. A special thank you to the Ford Family for capturing more of Penhold's rich history. Drive along Fleming Avenue for a trip down memory lane where five markers have been installed in the approximate location the original grain elevators stood. Additional information can be found on the Town's website.

Community Services

The Penhold Youth Club (PYC) program was approved for \$55,156.50 in funding through the Red Deer & District Family & Community Support Services (FCSS) for the 2027 – 2029 funding cycle.

Communications & Events

- The Town is ramping up for some exciting events occurring over the next several weeks:
- Canada Day Celebration – Wed. July 1 at Lincoln Street Rec
- Fall Festival – September 11 & 12
- Parade registrations are now open. This year's theme is "Fun on the Farm". Check out the website for more information.

Protective Services Report

Congratulations to three of our Penhold members: DC Flight, FF Parsons, and FF Neilly, for an excellent job as they competed in the Calgary Stair Climb mid-June alongside City of Red Deer and Red Deer County members. The challenge consists of climbing an incredible 57-storey tower, totaling 1,370 stairs, all in support of a cause that touches so many families. Funds raised through the event help Wellspring Canada continue providing free support, resources, and programs for people living with cancer and their loved ones.

The Futures on Fire Cadet program wrapped up for another year. Congratulations to all the cadets especially Cael Loney, the recipient of the ATCO scholarship.

Multiplex Concession Lease

Council approved Administration to enter into a three-year lease agreement for the Concession. An agreement will be signed, and the new operators will take over mid-August and open to the public in September.

Bylaw 849/2026 Subdivision and Development Authorities Bylaw received first reading. With the dissolution of Parkland Community Planning Services, the Town needed to draft a new Bylaw and find another entity to support efficient, transparent, and legislatively compliant decision-making, enabling the Town to effectively manage growth while minimizing risk and improving service delivery.

Council Round Table

- The Corn Hole tournament went well; Mayor Yargeau and Councillor Muller defeated Mayor Ramsay, Red Deer County; if it runs next year, it would be great to have more local participation.
- Council requested Administration explore twin towns/sister community programs and find a sister city within Canada.
- Council directed Administration to draft a Golf Cart Bylaw for review and consideration.

Council Round Table

Council requested admin to put forward Councillor Muller's name for the ABMunis Award of Excellence.

Funding Received for Hwy 2A & Minto St Drainage

The Town of Penhold is excited to announce that we have received funding through the Government of Alberta's Strategic Transportation Infrastructure Program (STIP).

Minister Devin Dreeshen attended the June 22 Council Workshop to present Mayor Mike and Council funding, up to \$88,987, through the Local Municipal Initiatives funding stream, for the Highway 2A Drainage at Minto Street project.

The funding will help support important drainage improvements along Highway 2A, enhancing infrastructure reliability and improving safety for both residents and visitors traveling through our community.

Thank you to the Ministry of Transportation and Economic Corridors for their support and partnership in helping Penhold build for the future.

Launch Your Human Powered Watercraft

If you have used your personal watercraft on a different body of water, please help stop the transfer of invasive species by ensuring it is clean & has been fully dried prior to placing it in the storm pond. Motorized watercraft / swimming are not permitted.



Wear Your Life Jacket

There is an aeration system in use. When air is introduced to water, it reduces the body's buoyancy and increases the risk of drowning. Scan the QR code to learn more.



Supervise Children

This area is not patrolled and there is no life guard. Please keep children within your arm's reach when they are on the dock.

Yard Waste Compost Bins

The Yard Waste Compost is now open for the season! It is scheduled to be open until the end of October, weather dependant.

The bins are located at the Northwest entrance of the Public Services Building located at 101 Waskasoo Ave (a half mile North of Oxford Blvd, east side of the road).

Accepted items in their designated bins include:

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Branches (no longer than 4 feet or 1 inch in diameter)
- No bags, garbage or animal feces are permitted in the bins.

Please be considerate, removing bags after they are in the bins is labour intensive. Please don't add to already full bins, they get checked and emptied on a regular basis. This is a great service to have, please help us keep it available!



Splash Park

The Splash Park Operating Hours are 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Daily.



The Lincoln Street Rec Centre building will be open for bathroom use during the operating hours of the park.

Splash Park Rules:

- Unsupervised area
- Parents do not leave children unattended
- No abusive language or objectionable behaviour
- No littering, please use garbage cans
- No pets allowed, leashed, or unleashed
- No wheeled items (bicycles, strollers, skateboards, scooter) should be on Splash Pad
- Washrooms are in the Rec Centre building

The Splash Park attendant is on site for Splash Park operations not supervision.

Please be considerate when using the Splash Park as this is a re-circulating water system and all water that goes down the drain must be treated. Unwanted substances can cause difficulties with the treatment system resulting in shutdowns. If the system is down, it is generally due to an unbalance in the chemical treatment system or clogged filters. If you notice a concern with the Splash Park system, please call 403-352-9352.

Please be patient with the attendant while they try to rectify the problem.



ODD / EVEN Watering Restriction is year round in Penhold

A reminder to comply with the Utility Bylaw as applicable to outdoor watering restrictions.

The Utility Bylaw 841/2026 indicates: Outdoor sprinkling restrictions shall be in effect at all times. Odd/Even Street addresses determines which days sprinkling will be allowed. The numerical address (excluding street name) which ends in an odd number may water on each odd day, and the numerical address (excluding street name) which ends in an even number may water each even day of the month. Outdoor sprinkling includes vehicle washing, lawn watering or other irrigation purposes on any day of the month.

Helpful Tips on Conserving Water

- Choose shrubs and groundcovers instead of turf for hard-to-water areas such as steep slopes and isolated strips.
- If water runs off your lawn easily, split your water time into shorter periods to allow for better absorption.
- We are more likely to notice leaks indoors, but don't forget to check outdoor faucets, sprinklers, and hoses for leaks.
- Use sprinklers for large areas of grass. Water small patches by hand to avoid waste.
- Collect water from your roof to water your garden.

Water bans may be implemented if necessary.



Maintenance of Boulevards and Alley Ways

Residents with a back alley are responsible to maintain the alley grass behind their fence, prune all trees or shrubs that interfere with any public utility or public works, traffic control devices or curb sight lines, that are/or could be a public safety hazard, including lines, poles, conduits, pipes, sewer, or other works of the Town or utility company on their premise or property. Thanks for helping to keep Penhold beautiful.

Residents who have grass boulevards adjacent to their properties are responsible for maintaining the area which includes edging of the grass along the sidewalk. The Town will look after any trees planted in the boulevards.

Gopher Control

It's getting to be that time of year again...the gophers are popping up all over Town. The Town of Penhold has hired a contractor to help control the gopher population within Town.

Moles and gophers can damage your lawn and garden. You can help control them humanely by eliminating their food source, spraying with liquid repellents, scattering repellent granules, using barriers and/or digging trenches lined with wire mesh or hardware cloth.

Pets in Greenspaces

The Town's greenspaces, playgrounds and Sport fields are multi-use areas, dogs are not permitted unleashed in these areas.

Please be respectful of others and pick up your dog's waste so everyone can enjoy our great spaces.

- \$10.00 per token for non-residents
- \$5.00 per token for residents
- Tokens can be purchased at the Town Office during regular business hours (Monday to Friday 8am-4:30pm excluding stat holidays. Closed for lunch between 12:00-12:30pm)

Preparing for a Power Outage

A general list of what to include in your emergency kit. For more, including how to create an emergency plan, visit alberta.ca/emergency-preparedness.

- Emergency kit:** Include water, non-perishable food, first aid kit, flashlight, radio and other items as recommended by the Canadian Red Cross.
- Emergency plan:** Set a meeting place. List tasks, contacts, documents, valuables, medication and other items to bring in case of evacuation.
- Charge devices:** Charge your cell phone and other communication tools. Pack extra batteries for other equipment.
- Fuel up:** Ensure your vehicle has enough fuel in case of evacuation.
- Animals:** Have food and supplies to keep pets and livestock safe.

Get the apps: Download apps to stay safe and informed, including, Alberta Emergency Alert and AB Wildfire Status.

- Unplug electronic devices:** Unplug devices that continually run or lack surge protection, such as TVs, computers and smart home devices.
- Important documents:** Gather or secure priceless items, cash and important personal documents.
- Other's needs:** Consider those who require power for medical devices. Bring activities for children.
- Below ground pumps:** To avoid potential flooding when power is restored, consider powering down below ground pumps or irrigation systems, if possible.

BICYCLISTS

Bicycling can be an efficient, healthy, and fun way to get around, but it pays to be safe. In 2020, 2% of fatalities were bicyclists.¹⁷

IMPROVE YOUR PROTECTION

- Always wear an approved helmet while riding
- Wear clothing that will:
 - protect you from the weather
 - protect you in a fall and
 - avoid wearing high heel shoes, sandals, and other loosely fitting shoes

INCREASE YOUR VISIBILITY TO OTHERS

- Wear light coloured or reflective clothing
- Keep in mind that drivers may not see you
- If riding at night, make sure your bike has lights on the front and back
- Be alert at intersections for turning vehicles

AGGRESSIVE RIDING

- Don't weave in and out of traffic
- Obey all traffic signs and signals; bicycles are vehicles
- Don't ride between the curb and heavy vehicles as they have large blind spots and may not be able to see you
- Be mindful riding next to parked cars
- Don't use cell phones or smart phones while riding

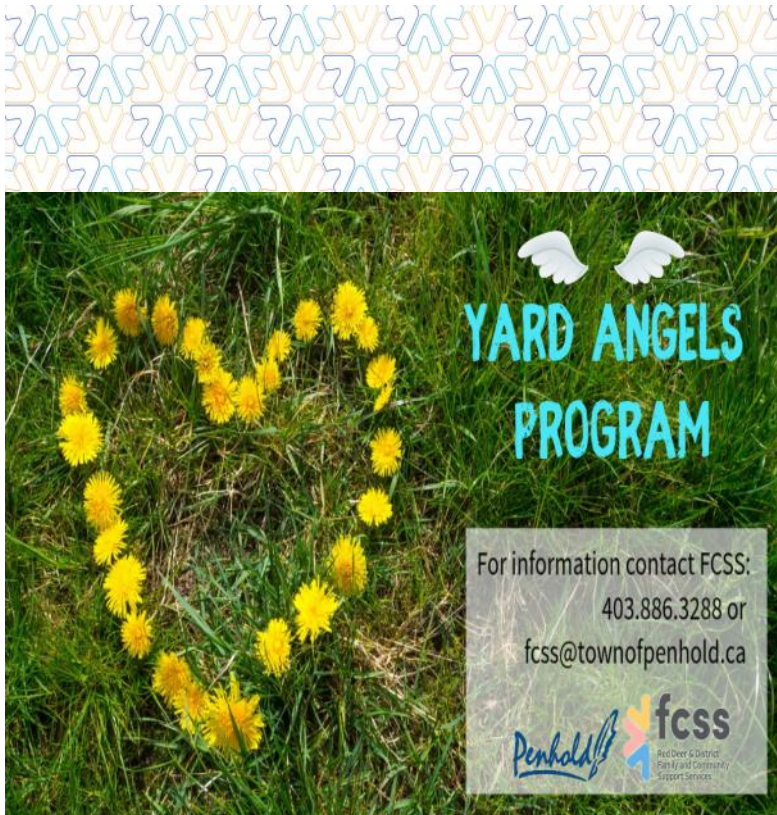

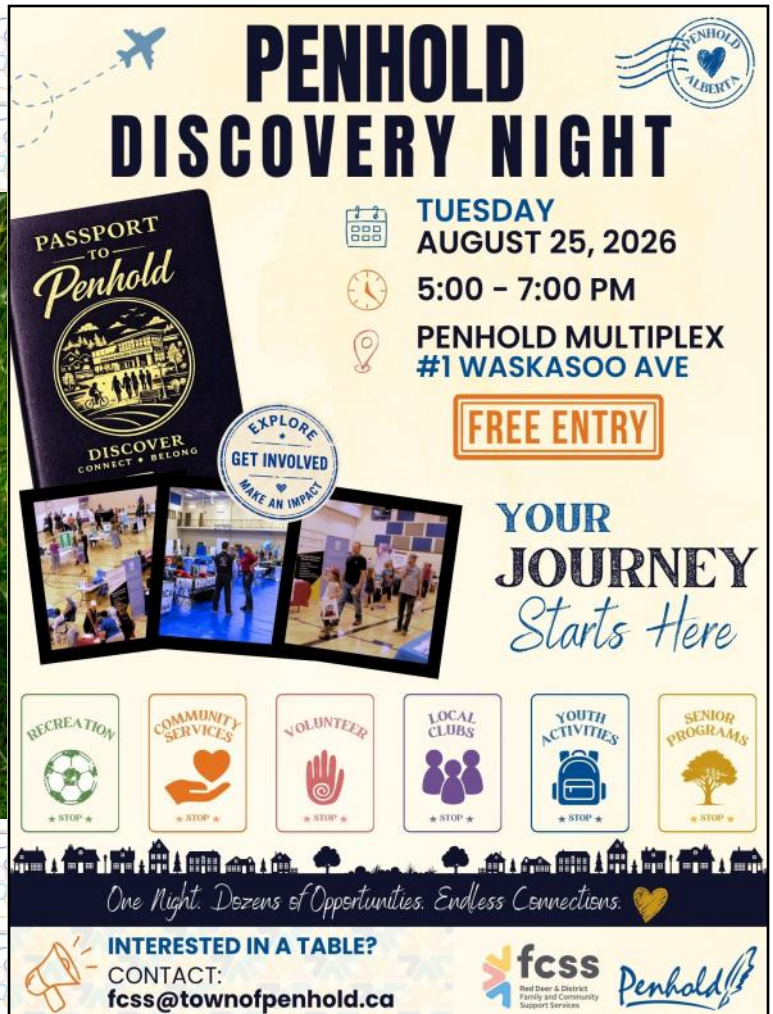

WHAT TO DO AFTER AN EMERGENCY

- 3** Locate and replace important documents such as birth certificates, marriage licenses, passports, wills, social insurance cards, divorce papers, credit cards, land titles, military discharge papers and more.



- 4** Register for a MyAlberta Digital ID to access government resources & supports.

- Assess the damage and begin clean-up and recovery.

- Reach out to others for formal and informal supports and resources including family and friends as well as any of the numbers provided on this card.
