COUNCIL CORNER

May 11, 2026 Council Meeting Report

Council had two Presentations:

2026 Mayor's Youth Award Recipient – Rylee Ehret

Rylee demonstrates genuine care and compassion, consistently supporting fellow students who need extra help with learning. Her enthusiasm and kindness have made a lasting impression on a Grade 1 class, who truly valued her supportive presence. Rylee's peers also recognize her for building meaningful relationships and showing sincere care for those around her. **Congratulations, Rylee.**

Revised Oxford Landing Outline Plan, Mr. Gordon Lau, Stantec & Gregg Broks, Melcor, highlights key changes:

- More mixed housing types within the area.
- Central Park - large green space, including soccer pitch, and recreational area.
- Additional vehicle access into the development off of Waskasoo Avenue will add further traffic calming coming in and out of the neighbourhood.
- Walking paths have been identified through the land parcel.
- Easy access to highways going north/south Highways 2A and QEII.
- Kitty corner/within walking distance to the Multiplex and schools.

Mayor Yargeau thanked Mr. Lau & Mr. Broks for the presentation and advised that this will be brought back to the next meeting for possible approval.

CAO Report:

Administration is working on a development agreement with Melcor that will include the development of the park area in this next phase this summer.

Chinooks Edge School Division received notification they are to receive four (4) additional portables at Jessie Duncan school. This is in the works for the upcoming school year.

Legislation for Joint Use Planning Agreements (JUPA) with school divisions are to be in place by June 10. Penhold has an agreement however, it needs to be updated with the new Waskasoo Middle School in town.

Penhold will have a strong presence at this year's AB Municipalities Conference with the moving of two (2) resolutions and seconding two (2) others. The Resolutions are:

Raising the threshold for acceptance to bring a stronger mandate by the association in presenting to the province.

Auditors are to comment on Municipal financial statements regarding possible irregularities within their audit for the municipality. Focus: changing the "may comment" to "must comment".

Supporting municipalities in offsite levies as a tool to help bring about better communities without current residents bearing the costs.

Aligning the financial/fiscal year end for municipalities with the province and federal govt.

Multiplex Report:

June 12-14: Central Sport is hosting their First Annual Cornhole Tournament in Penhold (see page 21 for info).

Operations Report:

High Water Users will see an additional break with the cost of sewer fees going down once 300 c/ms per month is reached. Anything over 300 will see a 1 dollar per c/m reduction above this volume.

May 25 Council Meeting

Public Hearing to Rezone 1001 Minto Street from Public Institutional District (PI) to Mixed Use District (MU)

Council held the Public Hearing for Bylaw 848/2026.

Jackson Hall, the purchaser, presented his plans for the site to Council. The former office area will include 2 residential spaces, while the bays will remain for commercial use. The site offers several potential uses.

Members of the public were given the opportunity to ask questions. Following a number of questions, administration indicated that any development on the site would require development and building permits moving forward.

CAO Report: The CAO met with Mr. Ulmer, Urban Systems and walked through the process for the Growth Strategy for Penhold, Bentley and Clive; first stage is data collection.

Tax Notices have been sent out. If you have not received your tax notice, please contact the town office.

Community Services: The Smile Cookie Campaign was a huge success, raising \$7,334.67 for the Penhold Youth Club (PYC). Thank you to everyone who supported the campaign this season.

Fire & Protective Services: Futures on Fire (ATCO Cadet competition) will be held May 23 at the Calgary Training Academy.

Applied to FCM for a grant in the Local Leadership for Climate Adaptation, Climate ready Plans and Processes. The purpose of this project would be to evaluate the hazards and risks within the community over a 2-year timeframe. The grant request was for \$70,000.

Oxford Landing Outline Plan: Council reviewed the updated Outline Plan and proceeded with second and third readings.

Administration is working on a development agreement with Melcor that will include the development of the park area in this next phase this summer.

Memorial Hall Survey Results: There was a great response from the community with 200+ survey responses being received. In addition to the survey, there were approximately 30 attendees at the Open House with seven additional comment cards received.

Council has asked administration to organize a committee to review/evaluate and make recommendations of possible funding sources that can be utilized to a possible restoration of Memorial Hall. Bylaw 848/2026 amending LUB 837/2025: Council gave 2nd and 3rd reading to Bylaw 848/2026 amending the Land Use Bylaw (LUB) 837/2025 Schedule "A" LU District Map, from current Public and Institutional (PI) District to Mixed-Use (MU).

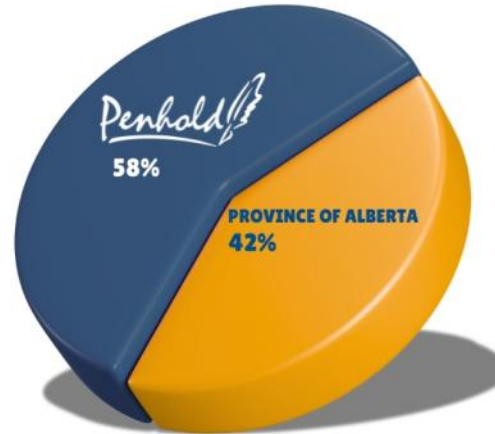

OPERATIONS

Yard Waste Compost Bins

The Yard Waste Compost is now open for the season! It is scheduled to be open until the end of October, weather dependant.

The bins are located at the Northwest entrance of the Public Services Building located at 101 Waskasoo Ave (a half mile North of Oxford Blvd, east side of the road).

Accepted items in their designated bins include:

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Branches (no longer than 4 feet or 1 inch in diameter)
- No bags, garbage or animal feces are permitted in the bins.

Please be considerate, removing bags after they are in the bins is labour intensive. Please don't add to already full bins, they get checked and emptied on a regular basis. This is a great service to have, please help us keep it available!

Splash Park

The Splash Park opened for the season on Friday May 29. Operating Hours are 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Daily.



The Lincoln Street Rec Centre building will be open for bathroom use during the operating hours of the park.

Splash Park Rules:

- Unsupervised area
- Parents do not leave children unattended
- No abusive language or objectionable behaviour
- No littering, please use garbage cans
- No pets allowed, leashed, or unleashed
- No wheeled items (bicycles, strollers, skateboards, scooter) should be on Splash Pad
- Washrooms are in the Rec Centre building

The Splash Park attendant is on site for Splash Park operations not supervision.

Please be considerate when using the Splash Park as this is a re-circulating water system and all water that goes down the drain must be treated. Unwanted substances can cause difficulties with the treatment system resulting in shutdowns. If the system is down, it is generally due to an unbalance in the chemical treatment system or clogged filters. If you notice a concern with the Splash Park system, please call 403-352-9352.

Please be patient with the attendant while they try to rectify the problem.





Weed Control/ Spraying

You can expect to see weed spraying starting this month at various locations around Penhold. Signs will be placed advising of impacted areas. We ask that residents obey the signage and avoid the area until all signs are removed.

There are only two herbicides permitted to be used within Penhold's green spaces:

1. Premium 3 way is used on the sports fields/ green spaces to control broadleaf weeds.
2. Roundup is a non-selective herbicide used to control grass and weeds within tree/ shrub beds, flower beds and along the asphalt/ gravel pathways.

**When Roundup is being sprayed it is important NOT to walk in the area until it dries to avoid transferring the spray with each step taken after contact to unintended locations. There are many different views on the use of herbicide, please understand the Operations staff avoid using herbicide until it is deemed necessary to control weeds ie. once handpicking is no longer effective and an efficient use of time/ funds.*

Summer Rainstorms

During storms and/or flooding it is important for residents to keep in mind that Operations' priority is the Town's water and wastewater systems. The Town of Penhold's Operations Department is mandated by Alberta Environment, during an emergency, to first and foremost protect life and health. We will do our best to get to your problem as soon as possible after all major threats have been dealt with. As much as a basement flooding may seem like an emergency, it will come second to the reservoir/water system and Lift Stations/sewer system.

Tips for Proper Drainage

- Create a sump pit and install a sump pump with reliable back up power; ensure pumps are operational.
- Make sure your lot is graded to aid drainage away from your home.
- Ensure sump hoses and down spouts are directed at least 6 feet away from your home's foundation.

****It is illegal to have any storm drainage discharging directly into the sewer system; check sump pumps for illegal connections. If they exist, have them removed immediately as the extra flow can overload the sewer system and create sewer backups in your house. ****

Reminder to comply with the outdoor sprinkling restrictions in Utility Bylaw 841/2026

A reminder to comply with the Utility Bylaw as applicable to outdoor watering restrictions.

The Utility Bylaw 841/2026 indicates: Outdoor sprinkling restrictions shall be in effect at all times. Odd/Even Street addresses determines which days sprinkling will be allowed. The numerical address (excluding street name) which ends in an odd number may water on each odd day, and the numerical address (excluding street name) which ends in an even number may water each even day of the month. Outdoor sprinkling includes vehicle washing, lawn watering or other irrigation purposes on any day of the month.



Maintenance of Boulevards and Alley Ways

Residents that have grass boulevards adjacent to their properties are responsible for maintaining the area which includes edging of the grass along the sidewalk. The Town will look after any trees planted in the boulevards.

Residents with a back alley are responsible to maintain the alley grass behind their fence, prune all trees or shrubs that interfere with any public utility or public works, traffic control devices or curb sight lines, that are/or could be a public safety hazard, including lines, poles, conduits, pipes, sewer, or other works of the Town or utility company on their premise or property. Thanks for helping to keep Penhold beautiful.

Gopher Control

It's getting to be that time of year again...the gophers are popping up all over Town. The Town of Penhold has hired a contractor to help control the gopher population within Town.

Moles and gophers can damage your lawn and garden. You can help control them humanely by eliminating their food source, spraying with liquid repellents, scattering repellent granules, using barriers and/or digging trenches lined with wire mesh or hardware cloth.

Street Sweeping

The streets will be swept periodically throughout the town from spring until fall in problem areas without signs being posted. THANKS to all that have obeyed the Street Sweeping no parking signs, it makes our job easier.

PLAYGROUND INSPECTIONS

The Town has scheduled a contractor, mid June, to conduct playground inspections. This is in addition to our own inspections that are done.



Notice to Residents: Tree Caterpillars in Local Parks

This warm, dry spring has led to an increase in caterpillar activity in some of our local parks and green spaces. Town staff are aware of the situation and are actively monitoring and managing it using best practices.

At this time, the exact species has not been confirmed. While these caterpillars can cause significant leaf loss (defoliation), they do not typically kill healthy trees.

Residents may come across various tips and control methods online, but these can vary in effectiveness and may have environmental impacts. If you're looking for more information, we encourage you to consult reliable sources, such as the City of Red Deer website.

Campfire Safety

Check Town website for detailed info about Fire Services Bylaw 830/2024

Sitting under the stars by a crackling fire has its appeal. It's where stories are told, sing-a-longs happen, and meals are cooked over an open flame. Campfires bring family and friends together. But campfire mishaps can cause injuries. With a few safety tips, you can prevent these accidents.

SAFETY AROUND THE FIRE

- Before setting up a campfire, be sure it is permitted. Check with your local fire department.
- If campfires are permitted, they need to be at least 25 feet away from any structure and anything that can burn.
- Clear away dry leaves and sticks, overhanging low branches and shrubs.
- Avoid burning on windy, dry days. It is easier for open burning to spread out of control when it is windy and dry.
- Watch children while the fire is burning. Never let children or pets play or stand too close to the fire.
- Attend to the campfire at all times. A campfire left alone for only a few minutes can grow into a damaging fire.
- Keep a campfire small which is easier to control.
- Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids.
- Always have a hose, bucket of water, or shovel and dirt or sand nearby to put out the fire. Make sure to put it completely out before leaving the site.
- If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, and roll. Stop, drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands. Roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.
- Treat a burn right away. Cool the burn with cool water for 3 to 5 minutes. Cover with a clean, dry cloth. Get medical help if needed.



ROAST WITH CARE

If roasting marshmallows, help young children. Never shake a roasting marshmallow. It can turn into a flying, flaming ball. A heated metal skewer can cause burns.

Alley way maintenance reminder from the Community Peace Officers



Weeds flourish with all the rain we have had recently. Please make sure you maintain the weeds in the alley alongside your fence.

In accordance with Bylaw 756-2018 residents must maintain their property "...up to the center of lanes or alleys at the rear or side of the premises;"

It is a great time of year to enjoy a fire in your backyard. For your safety, please make sure you have a water source nearby and your fire pit meets following guidelines:

- A minimum of 3 meters (10 feet) clearance, measured from the nearest fire pit edge to the nearest edge of building, property line, or other combustible material;
- The fire chamber area shall not exceed 0.5m (17.7 cubic feet);
- Equipped with a mesh screen with openings no larger than 6mm (1/4 inch);
- Enclosed sides made from bricks, concrete, blocks, heavy gauge metal (minimum 18 gauge thickness), or other non-combustible materials; and
- Not located over any underground utilities or under any above ground wires.

RV / Trailer Parking Reminder



RV Parking on Private Property:

RVs may be parked on an **approved hard surface* parking pad**** (as per Land Use Bylaw) in the front yard of a residential parcel, or the front or a flanking side yard of a residential parcel, as long as they do not overhang the sidewalk or road.

RVs cannot be parked on landscaped areas, including front or side yards, on your property.

At no time shall any recreational vehicle be parked with slide-outs obstructing safe movement of vehicle traffic or pedestrian traffic.

No part of any RV can overhang sidewalk, street, or lane or otherwise create a traffic hazard.

RVs must not block traffic or pedestrians.

No unattached RVs / trailers can be parked in front of, across from or adjacent to residential property at any given time.




Park, Pack & Prepare your RV in 72 hours



Park, Pack & Prepare your RV in 72 hours:

Between April 1 & October 15 annually, recreational vehicles (RV) may be parked on Town of Penhold roads for up to 72 consecutive hours for the purpose of loading and unloading. After 72 hours, RVs must be moved to a different location for at least 48 consecutive hours before being parked on the road again.
