4.3 Trish Willis, Corporate Services Manager – Taxation Bylaw #742/17

- Amendments included changes in grants received from the Province;
- A 9% increase in the school requisition required for 2017; and reflecting the major project costs tenders for 2017.
- A balanced budget was presented with a small anticipated surplus of \$5,636.
- The Tax Rate Bylaw #742/17 and minimum tax bylaw was presented to council.
 The tax rate remained the same for residential and commercial/industrial.
 WITH THE DECREASE IN ASSESSMENTS THIS WILL REPRESENT A DECREASE ON PROPERTY TAXES BETWEEN 2% TO 4%.
- Minimum taxation rate was increased from \$250 to \$300. Council thanked administration for all the work that was done to ensure the tax bill goes down for our residents.
